



Alignments

With the introduction of the front-wheel drive and all-wheel drive vehicle, alignments instantly became more complicated, and yes, somewhat more expensive. Most of the front-wheel drive and all-wheel drive vehicles have alignment adjustments on all four wheel positions – and these adjustments must be set within vehicle specifications to insure proper handling, proper tire wear, and increased fuel economy. Here are the most common signs of an alignment problem:

1. Vehicle pulls to left or right
2. Uneven or rapid tire wear
3. Steering wheel is crooked when driving straight
4. Squealing tires

Even if your vehicle tracks straight, it is a good idea to have your alignment checked once or twice per year to protect your tire investment.
